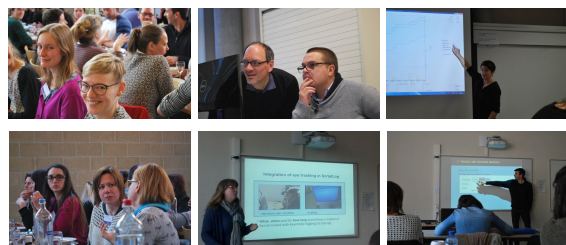

Conducting Evidence Syntheses on Literacy Research | 18-20 April 2016

The ELN Ljubljana meeting will be held at the Faculty of Education of the University of Ljubljana (Slovenia). Marija Kavkler, Lidija Magajna, Milena Košak Babuder, and Mira Metljak are the local organizers.

Literacy research has progressed much in identifying key aspects of literacy development and how to effectively promote it in a world facing a digital revolution. The main goals of this meeting are to establish the ELN Societal Team and to advance the works towards the accomplishment of the Action's societal goals.

On April 18, the SG of the Action will meet to evaluate the COST Action IS1401ELN initial 16 months and discuss GP2 Work and Budget Plan.

On April 19-20, there will be keynote sessions (see right panel) and several parallel sessions, which will gather representatives from the Action's three WGs along with their most active teams. The meeting is open to literacy researchers and the general interested public.

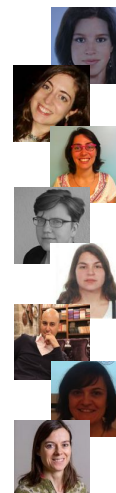
Sven Strömqvist
